Picture taking to provide memories, refreshments, raffle prizes and flowers for the young ladies topped off a night to remember. Thank you to the Lakeview PTO for organizing and hosting the event.

"I Love Reading Month" was a huge success. Mrs. Harr, our quintessential Librarian, challenged the student to read 250,000 minutes. Well they surpassed the challenge and we had to make good on our promise. Mrs. Harr and I had **very green hair!** (A special "Thank you" goes to Mrs. Vasquez, who has risen to the occasion every year to style and color our hair.) As Mrs. Harr and I visited classrooms later in the day we were greeted with, "You look like Trolls. You look like leprechauns. Is it a wig?" The day was exciting to say the least.

Other exciting news-With several generous donations by Lakeview parents, we were able to purchase 5 Promethean ActivBoards, one for each of the first grade classrooms. The teachers are very excited and so are the first graders. We were able to have the boards placed on stands, so that the height could be adjusted a bit lower for the younger students. The teachers will be receiving more training on Monday the 9th, our minimum day.

As part of our commitment to provide a

healthy and safe environment for our students, we have become a part of the "Safe and Civil Schools Program" which is designed to create a "safe, civil, and productive school." We have 3 teachers, 2 yard supervisors and me as the "team". After surveying the staff and the students we began looking at the "common areas", areas where students gather. We are currently updating and revising procedures for the students and staff and are very pleased with the results so far. The core beliefs of our team are,

- School is important to a student's success in life
- Students come first.
- All of the people in a school should be treated with respect and dignity.
- Our school setting should be structured for student success.
- All students should receive frequent positive feedback on their behavioral and academic efforts.

Thank you to the Lakeview PTO for sponsoring our paper drive. During these lean financial times, we are most grateful for your generosity. We received 472 reams of paper. This was 116 more reams than we collected last year. Winners of the paper drive are: Mrs. Bazor's and Mrs. Nelson's classes for the K-2 grades with 65 reams of paper collected by each class. For the 3-5 grades, Ms. Dermer's class won with 68 reams collected. Thank you to all.
